**Please review with your students before you arrive at the museum or park:**

## **Rule Number 1: Respect one another**

- Stand/sit so that everyone can see.
- Talk one at a time and loud enough to be heard but not so loud that other visitors to the museum or park are disturbed.

## **Rule Number 2: Respect the art**

- Stand approximately one foot away from the art so that you don't accidentally touch it. The natural oils on fingers could damage the art.



- SAM allows non-flash photography in most areas, except the special exhibit galleries and when indicated with a no photography icon.
- Commercial photography and videography are prohibited in the Olympic Sculpture Park. Personal photography is permitted but may not be used commercially.
- Sketching with dry media only (pencils, colored pencils or chalk) is permitted in the museum's galleries. Please bring your own materials.
- Bags, purses, lunch bags and backpacks larger than 11x15 inches must be checked (for teachers and chaperones only) or placed in a school storage bin (for students).
- No eating food/chewing gum in the museum galleries.

## **Rule Number 3: Respect others, the building and the park**

- Walk so that you don't run into anything or anyone.
- Please stay on paths and walkways of the Olympic Sculpture Park.
- If it rains and you eat your sack lunches in the Olympic Sculpture Park Pavilion, please yield tables and chairs to non-school group visitors and refrain from rough play.
