

Anida Yoeu Ali makes her SAM debut in this solo exhibition that explores public encounters and political agitation as art forms. Centering two dynamic performance-based works, *The Buddhist Bug* and *The Red Chador*, Ali invites viewers to witness as she disrupts preconceived notions of what it means to be other.

The Red Chador will be performed on June 1, 2024.


The Buddhist Bug will be performed on March 23, 2024.
