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SEATTLE ART MUSEUM PRESENTS PROGRAMS AND EVENTS FOR JEFFREY GIBSON: LIKE A HAMMER

Highlights include an artist talk, a fashion show of Indigenous designers, and special editions of Remix and Legendary Children



SEATTLE, WA - The Seattle Art Museum presents <u>Jeffrey Gibson: Like a</u> <u>Hammer</u> (February 28-May 12, 2019), a major survey of the acclaimed contemporary artist who draws on diverse influences such as abstraction, Indigenous art, queer aesthetics, and pop culture. The exhibition features over 65 works including abstract geometric paintings on rawhide and canvas, beaded punching bags, sculptures, wall hangings, and video.

In conjunction with the exhibition, SAM will present a dynamic lineup of programs for the public, families and caregivers, and schools and educators. Highlights include a free community opening with a talk by the artist; a fashion show spotlighting Indigenous designers; and special editions of popular recurring programs including Remix, a night of eclectic performances, tours, dancing, creating; and Legendary Children, a partnership with the Seattle Public Library celebrating QTPOC (queer and trans people of color) artists.

ABOUT SEATTLE ART MUSEUM

As the leading visual art institution in the Pacific Northwest, SAM draws on its global collections, powerful exhibitions, and dynamic programs to provide unique educational resources benefiting the Seattle region, the Pacific Northwest, and beyond. SAM was founded in 1933 with a focus on Asian art. By the late 1980s the museum had outgrown its original home, and in 1991 a new 155,000-square-foot downtown building, designed by Venturi, Scott Brown & Associates, opened to the public. The 1933 building was renovated and

reopened as the Asian Art Museum in 1994. SAM's desire to further serve its community was realized in 2007 with the opening of two stunning new facilities: the nine-acre Olympic Sculpture Park (designed by Weiss/Manfredi Architects)—a "museum without walls," free and open to all—and the Allied Works Architecture designed 118,000-square-foot expansion of its main, downtown location, including 232,000 square feet of additional space built for future expansion. The Olympic Sculpture Park and SAM's downtown expansion celebrated their tenth anniversary in 2017.

From a strong foundation of Asian art to noteworthy collections of African and Oceanic art, Northwest Coast Native American art, European and American art, and modern and contemporary art, the strength of SAM's collection of approximately 25,000 objects lies in its diversity of media, cultures, and time periods.
